

William Harris Leaford

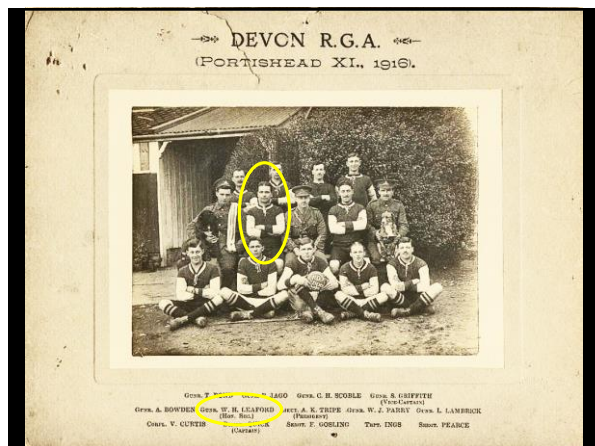
- William Harris Leaford**
- Born 1895
 - 1904 – 1909 Member of the 4th Plymouth Boys Brigade, reaching the rank of Corporal
 - 1911 Living at 166 Grenville Road with parents, sisters and grandfather and working as an Outfitters Assistant
 - 1916 Joined the 187 Siege Battery - Royal Garrison Artillery – formed in Plymouth
 - Died 10 August 1917 in Belgium. His parents lived at 35 Chaddlewood Avenue

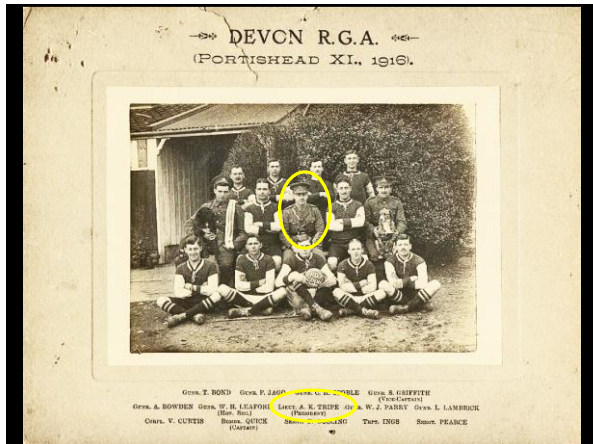

Alfred King Tripe

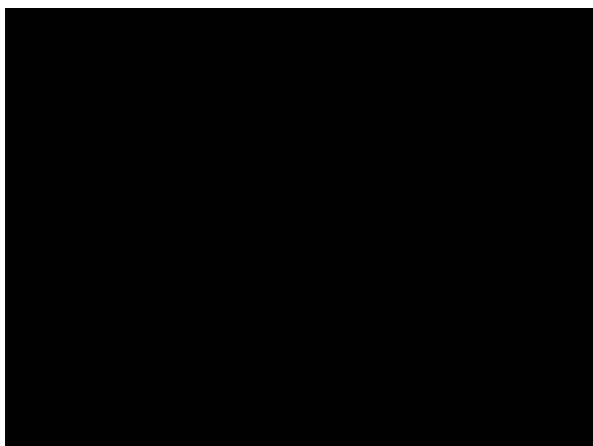
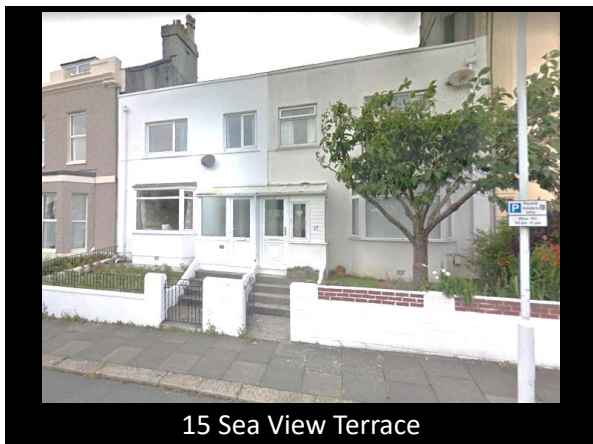
- Born 1887 in Plymouth

Alfred King Tripe

- From the Ford Park Gravestone, Alfred's Father was a widower, a retired Army Captain, Walter Delamaine Tripe (Alfred was also the nephew of Major General Linnaeus Tripe of the Madras Army)
- In Alfred's Will Probate Record, his father Walter Delamaine Tripe, is referred to as a 'Lay Reader', living at 15 Sea View Terrace...
